Capable of developing realistic action plans while remaining sensitive to time constraints and resource availability. Ability to actively participate on a dynamic senior leadership team comprised of division chiefs and the Directorate. Demonstrate a well-developed sense of ethics and integrity.

Job Summary:

The AGFC Chief of Recreational Shooting is responsible for overseeing the daily operations of the AGFC Recreational Shooting Division. This position is governed by state and federal laws and agency policy.

Typical Functions:

- Supervises a professional and administrative support staff by interviewing applicants, making hire or termination recommendations, training, assigning and reviewing work, and evaluation the performance of incumbents.
- Develops, monitors, and conducts education and training programs designed to train volunteers for various educational programs and participates in the presentation of special interest seminars.
- Writes and reviews information designed to communicate to the public through programs, media, and other communication outlets concerning educational programs and regulation requirements.
- Provides technical assistance with the design and development of education training aids and materials.
- Designs, develops, and maintains exhibits and information booths at special events and activities such as school career day activities and fairs.
- Performs special research projects and provides technical information and assistance to various colleges, high schools, and the general public.
- Visits community leaders and school administrators to evaluate the implementation and effectiveness of the various programs.
- Develops and oversees annual budgets for programs within the assigned region.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities:

The Recreational Shooting Division Chief will supervise two statewide coordinators, the existing Program Coordinators of the Arkansas National Archery in the Schools Program and the Arkansas Youth Shooting Sports Program, and the Facility Managers of the Fiochii Shooting Sports Complex at Camp Robinson Firing Range. They will also help support the range at Grandview Prairie Nature Center and Fred Berry Nature Center. The Chief will also supervise future development of new shooting range opportunities across the state.

The Chief position will also coordinate shooting range management and development, execute strategic agency goals, create and maintain an annual budget, manage grant funds, develop partnerships with cities and organizations across the state, and work across the agency to accomplish the work of the division. This position will actively participate on the intra-agency team of division chiefs to engage strategic plan goals and support the work of agency staff.

The Chief will need to maintain certification as a hunter education instructor and Basic Archery instructor, and complete the NRA Range Safety Officer program. The Chief must also have extensive knowledge of firearms safety regulations, firearms, ammunition, archery equipment and related supplies. They must show a high degree of understanding around the recreational shooting community and the disciplines used in our statewide programs. Frequent in-state travel and weekend work will be required. Occasional out-of-state travel may be requested.
